Roles in NHS Management

Clinical Manager:

Head of your own department, ensuring that patients get the best possible treatment and care. You'll already be a trained healthcare professional, such as a nurse or allied health professional. You'll be leading a team of your peers or a multidisciplinary team where a mix of professionals work together to deliver care such as maternity or the NHS 111 service. You may also be managing a function such as <u>clinical audit</u> or governance.

Just some of your responsibilities could be:

- setting priorities
- planning for future development
- budget management



- ensuring value for money and quality in the services
- responsible for clinical governance and <u>clinical audit</u> programmes aimed at improving health services to patients. Work in <u>clinical audit</u> or clinical governance, closely involved in any changes to services for patients

A paramedic is a health care professional whose primary role is to provide advanced emergency medical care for critical and emergent patients who access the emergency medical service. Not all ambulance personnel are paramedics.

Skills needed in the NHS.

It's also vital that you have a number of transferable

skills to back up your application, such as good time management, having a sympathetic manner, being able to problem solve and also being able to handle the workload that comes with working for a big organisation. You'll also need to have great language and numerical skills.



Entry Requirements

You'll need a **minimum of** five 9-4 grade GCSEs (or the equivalent), including maths, English, and science plus two A levels or qualifications for an undergraduate degree. Some universities may ask for three A levels or equivalent.

It is possible to start in an entry level post without formal qualifications, but GCSEs or equivalent qualifications are an advantage. Apprenticeships in health informatics are also available.

"The NHS' aim is to move to a 'digital-first' model of care within the next 10 years, so by 2030, most people are likely to be accessing healthcare via apps and technology. "Providing access to healthcare via technology will hugely increase how effective the NHS will be in delivering care.

Technologies including AI, smartphone apps, wearable devices and even drones all look set to be integrated into the NHS

Predictions for the future of the NHS

ID Medical has predicted that by 2021/2022 we could see the advent of smartphone apps providing therapy for mental health conditions — such as depression and anxiety — more widely in the UK. It adds that other digital technologies including virtual and augmented reality will also be used by the NHS to treat these disorders in the future.
