Entry Requirements

Do you meet the basic standards which are needed to join the British Army?

Aged between 16-49 Nationality (e.g., British, Irish or a commonwealth citizen. Health & Fitness (e.g., Fit and no Injuries. Medical Conditions (not all conditions mean you cannot apply)

Education

There are roles in the Army which range from needing no GCSEs or other qualifications to join, for specialist roles requiring professional qualifications. If you do not have exam results due to COVID disruption, we will accept the grades you have been predicted, we will have something for everyone no matter what your grades are.

Army Life

The Army is different from most jobs. The people you work alongside aren't just your colleagues, they're your best friends. And you don't just get brilliant training and support, you get somewhere to call home. **Day to Day Life?**

You'll normally work 8.30am to about 5pm, Monday to Friday.

If you're a soldier, you'll usually be working on your base, using your trade skills, or developing new ones. Officers will usually spend this time in an office, workshop, or medical centre on base.

When you're on exercise or operations, you'll be away from your routine life. Operations can last up to 6 months, and you're usually given plenty of notice.

Your Benefits?

Soldiers and officers enjoy a range of benefits, including travel and adventurous training, access to additional training and developing transferable skills. You also get six weeks paid leave, free dental and medical cover, subsidised food and accommodation, free gyms and sports facilities, and automatic entry into a pension scheme.

The future of the British Armed Forces

The future of the Army is often referred to as the Army 2020 (A2020), which is the transformation of the British Army for the 2020s and beyond in response to the strategic challenges it is likely to face in the future. It will be changing the way it operates. It will involve thinking about emerging threats, how we deal with them, and the skills, capabilities, and equipment that they will need.

Future Soldier will see an overhaul of training for soldiers, with a new British Army Soldier Academy set to be launched that will sit alongside officer training delivered through the Royal Military Academy Sandhurst. Together, with a virtual NCO Academy, these will deliver coordinated foundation training for everyone that joins the British Army.

Army personnel will be given more control over their career choices as part of The Army People Plan, scheduled to be published in early 2022. A new Career Management Portal, for both Reserve and Regular personnel, will allow soldiers to apply to change their role, cap badge or trade online.

What are the roles and responsibilities of the Armv?

Armed forces officers defend the United Kingdom and its overseas territories. Armed forces officers are the managers of the military world. They lead others to defend their country and to support international peacekeeping and humanitarian efforts across the globe.

What is the safest role in the army?

No job in the military is totally safe as you can always be deployed to a combat role if this is your career choice. Many of the administration roles are non-combat and are carried out at base.
