Dear Parent/Carer

As school finishes for the half-term break, I wanted to write to thank you for your support throughout the first half-term of the school year.

I am delighted with the way that the vast majority of students have returned to school with such a positive attitude and the way in which Year 7 have managed to find their way around the building so quickly. I am also very impressed to see a large number of students taking advantage of our extra-curricular offer this half-term. Hopefully, we will see even bigger numbers after the holiday. Thank you to those of you who continue to ensure that your child(ren) attends school every day wearing full and correct uniform. We continue to strive to endure that all students are correctly dressed as per the uniform policy which is available on the school website and thank you for your support with this.

Please can I ask that you remind your child(ren) of the importance of being punctual to school and to lessons throughout the school day. Students are required to be on site at 8.35 am each morning to ensure they arrive at their form room/assembly on time. We are monitoring punctuality closely and would very much value your support in helping us to improve this further.

We know that sometimes our students cannot come to school because they are really unwell - and that's the right thing to do for them and other students. Medical advice is clear however that children with mild illness will often be well enough to attend - for example if they have a cough, or cold, without a temperature. This section contains information which may be useful for people facing challenges at what continues to be a difficult time for many. There is also an option to report any concerns you may have. Keighley College Apprenticeship Panel Visit










PSHE @ Holy Family

Year 7 have kicked their learning off exploring the core virtue of 'Respect' and how to manage friendships and bullying.

Year 8 have looked at addressing extremism and discrimination.

Looking at belonging; protected characteristics and reporting discrimination and values and managing disagreement constructively.

Year 9 have built on previous knowledge looking at 'Combatting Crime'. This unit highlights the importance that each individual member of society has, to help prevent, protect, and support one another in order to keep people safe. With a specific focus on knife crime and organised crime, Year 9 have produced posters, supporting the #KnifeFree campaign.

Year 10 have also been studying the same theme, looking at Understanding the Law. These lessons have been designed to allow students to explore their legal rights and responsibilities as they approach adulthood. Students are encouraged to consider the new situations they may find themselves in as a result of their increasing independence and be able to navigate these situations respectfully and safely. They are introduced to laws that protect against discrimination and support equality, as well as offences relating to public order.

During their form time PSHE sessions, Year 11 have been looking at Life Beyond School, in particular Financial Management. Exploring the difference between credit and debt, how to understand pay slips and their employment rights.







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
