### **CONCEPTS**

Introduction to repetition – Students will be introduced to dramatic and rehearsal techniques and be able to implement these to create theatre and storytelling. Techniques will be revisited to cement students' knowledge.

**Subject language** – students will be able to explain the processes that a performer develops to create art using specific subject language.

**Group work** – students will be able to work in small groups as well as individually. Students will understand compromise and the art of listening to ideas and trying things out.
