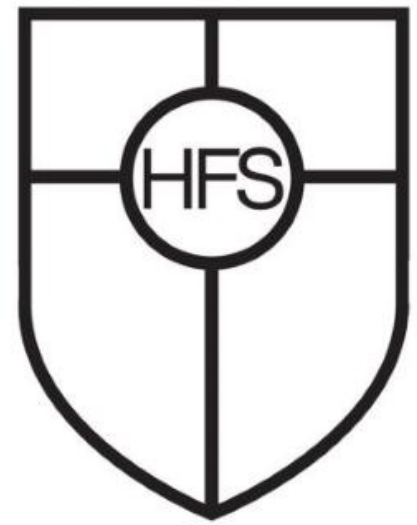

## CONCEPTS

**Revelation (Hear):** Students will be able to explain how God reveals Himself through Scripture and Tradition, interpret key biblical texts, and understand the role of revelation in Christian faith.

**Belief (Believe):** Students will be able to describe and analyse core Catholic beliefs and explain how these shape Christian identity and understanding of God.

**Worship & Sacrament (Celebrate):** Students will be able to explain the significance of prayer, liturgy, and the sacraments in Catholic life, and evaluate how Christians celebrate and express their faith in community and practice.

**Discipleship & Moral Life (Live):** Students will be able to analyse how Christian moral teaching and Catholic Social Teaching guide decisions, relationships, and responsibilities, and apply these to ethical issues in contemporary society.

**Dialogue:** Students will be able to evaluate the Church's relationship with other Christian traditions, other world religions (such as Judaism and Islam), and non-religious worldviews, and explain the importance of respectful dialogue for peace and truth.

**Encounter:** Students will be able to describe the beliefs and practices of other religions and worldviews, compare them with Catholic faith, and reflect on shared values and differences in order to foster understanding and respect.

**Ways of Knowing:** Students will be able to develop knowledge of faith, critically analyse meaning and truth and apply insights to their own lives and communities both inside and outside of their own.
